



FIELDS OREGON-

Fields Oregon, was first established in 1881 by Charles Fields as a roadhouse on the stagecoach line between Winnemucca, NV and Burns, OR. In 1911, he sold out to John Smyth. Smyth named the post office for Fields when it was established in 1913.

Fields is about as far as one can get from anywhere – 112 miles south of Burns, and a long, long way from anywhere else in fact it is so far out in the desert that airplanes occasionally land on the highway, pull in to the gas station, and tank up right from the pumps. Folks as far away as Germany and England come to the tiny town of Fields to enjoy the café which serves world famous milkshakes and cheeseburgers, they even keep track of those sold each year on a scoreboard.

There is a café, store, gas station, RV park, hotel/motel, post office, a few homes & behind the store is a historic cemetery. Across the highway from the café is a tree-lined pond, sometimes called the Fields Oasis, where you can almost always find great-horned owls.

Tom & Sandy Downs, who now operate all the businesses in Fields, are happy to welcome the many visitors each year.

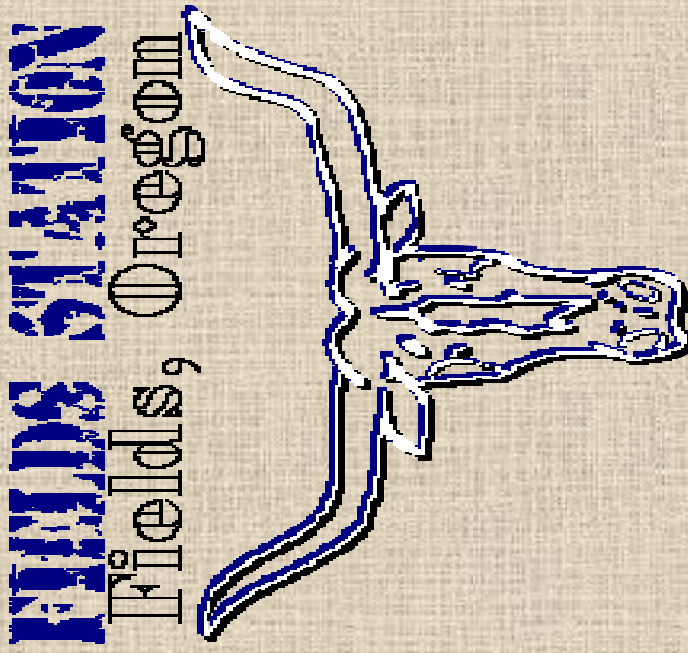

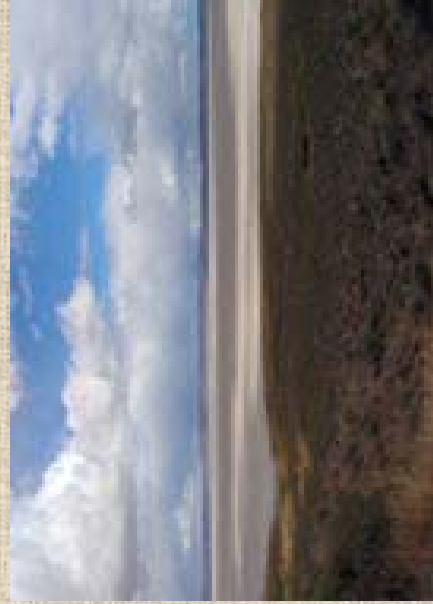
ALVORD DESERT-

The **Alvord Desert** is a desert. It is roughly southeast of Steens Mountain. The Alvord Desert is a 12 by 7 mile playa, a dry lake bed, and averages 7 inches of rain a year.

During the dry season, the surface is flat enough to drive across, or land small aircraft on.

ALVORD HOT SPRINGS-

Alvord Hot Springs is a geothermal spring located in the southeastern corner the spring lies on the western edge of the Alvord Desert into which the spring flows and eventually evaporates. To the west of the springs lies Steens Mountain, a north-south running fault with a peak of 9773 feet above sea level.



HUNTING & FISHING-

Our hunting area includes the spectacular Pueblo Mountains contain ancient rocks, lava flows, aspen-filled canyons, and a noticeable lack of development. Populated by a wide range of animals and plants, keep an eye out for bear, deer, pronghorn herds, cougar, chucker, quail, pheasant & sage grouse.

Mann Lake is located past the Alvord Desert. This is sage covered high desert country. This lake offers spectacular early season fishing in a spectacular setting. Mann Lake is full of Lahontan Cutthroat trout.

STEENS MOUNTAIN-

Steens Mountain in eastern Oregon, is the most well-known Basin and Range uplift. The raw, nearly vertical east face towers more than 5000 feet above the Alvord Desert and playa, dominating the landscape. From the west, the gentle slopes lure visitors to its layered interior, which is exposed in the rugged gorges carved by glacial ice and corrosive rivers. Steens Mountain is a classic north-south fault block and consists of many layers of distinct lava flows. The scramble up the imposing headwall of Big Indian Gorge will reward adventurous scramblers with a sense of accomplishment. Although you are able to drive to the top of Steens Mountain, scrambling up the gorge gives you a unique perspective on this Oregon natural wonder.
